

Screening Saves Lives

3D Screening Mammography

- The American College of Radiology (ACR) and Society of Breast Imaging (SBI) recommend that women of average risk start having an annual exam at age 40
- Uninsured or underinsured patients may qualify for screenings through the Rhode Island Department of Health's Women's Cancer Screening Program
- 3D Screening Mammograms are available at 12 RIMI locations
- We have 4 spa-like breast imaging centers for diagnostic patients

CT Lung Cancer Screening

- First comprehensive outpatient lung cancer screening program in Rhode Island
- Screenings are covered by most insurance companies
- Smokers between the ages of 50-80 should speak with their healthcare provider about eligibility (Age varies depending on insurance)
- Available at 9 RIMI locations



CT Cardiac Calcium Scoring (CCS)

- According to the American College of Cardiology (ACC) and the American Heart Association (AHA) patients between the ages of 40-75 with an increased risk of heart disease should have this exam every 2-5 years
- The test quantifies a patient's risk of having heart disease or a heart attack
- Available at 3 RIMI locations for a \$150 self-pay rate

Virtual Colonoscopy (CTC)

- According to the US Preventive Services Task Force (USPSTF) patients between the ages of 45-75 should be screened for colorectal cancer
- CTC is a less invasive screening test that does not require anesthesia
- Great option for any patient with a previously incomplete colonoscopy
